Font: Tahoma, 12 pts, spacing 1½.

Please e-mail your article in electronic form (* doc./*docx) to your supervising editor, who will organize the further review process and serve as your contact.

The article should not contain any footnotes or hyphenations. If footnotes are indispensable, please note them in brackets within the text. No further subdivisions.

For publishing purposes, the author's full address should be noted on the last page of the article:

Please do not *italicize* author's names within the manuscript.

At the end of each review, please note the reviewer's first and surname as well as his place of residence or work, e.g.

Headline

First- and Surname of the author / if necessary (Ed), **Title**. Subtitle / if necessary (= Series Vol). Publisher, edition, location year. Pages, Tables.
